

Please Heed "Warning - Wildlife Crossing Area" Signs



Our efforts to protect our local wildlife seem to take one step forward and then one backwards. It was heartbreaking last month to learn that a second deer had been struck and killed on Faraday in Carlsbad. Our regional arterial roads, often 120' wide with fast moving cars, are no match for even the most fleet-footed deer. But this area is right above a wildlife undercrossing. It took years to get the undercrossing included in the roadway extension design. Then it took more years to get the signs installed "Warning - wildlife crossing area." But studies show it takes a generation of wildlife using undercrossings before this becomes the preferred movement corridor. What we need is for the people who drive the road to pay attention to those warning signs. Our lives are enriched by the wonderful natural lands literally in our backyards. We can co-exist with our local wildlife who lived here before we came. But we need to be conscious of things like those warning signs - and give the deer time to learn how to safely coexist with us.
