Gnatcatcher Protection Challenged Again

Our little California Coastal Gnatcatcher is again the center of controversy. Since it was first identified as a potential species at risk of extinction back in 1982, the building

industry has launched a thirty year challenge to its protection. This latest challenge is based on faulty science and is really just about putting development first. To date, according to the National Resources Defense Council, southern California has lost 70-90% of its coastal sage scrub habit "largely due to development". Without gnatcatcher protection under the Endangered Species Act we can expect that the majority of the coastal sage scrub habitat necessary for its survival will be lost to development. With that loss we would lose not just this single species, but our sense of place as coastal southern California - a place that is unique and irreplaceable.

But this one bird is just the tip of the iceberg. Climate scientists predict that 50% of the species on earth could become extinct by 2050 if we do not take serious action to address climate change. President Obama took an important step by vetoing the Keystone XL pipeline. This month we have several opportunities to make a difference locally- from a workshop in Vista on how to reduce your energy bill and tap in to thousands of dollars in rebates, to a lecture by Rear Admiral (ret.) Len Hering on national security impacts, to a march and rally in San Diego. Together we can make a difference- but the time to start is now.
